About This List. This list of 52 primer “service word” non-nouns first appeared in Dr. Edward Dolch’s 1948 book, *Problems in Reading*.

This list is useful for primer age children and anyone learning English as a second language (ESL/EFL). There are other Dolch lists for pre-primer, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grades, as well as a 95-word “Nouns” list.

Service words include connecting words such as “a”, “the”, and “and”, as well as common adjectives, adverbs, and so on.

Students should review the Dolch words until they are able to recognize them on sight.
